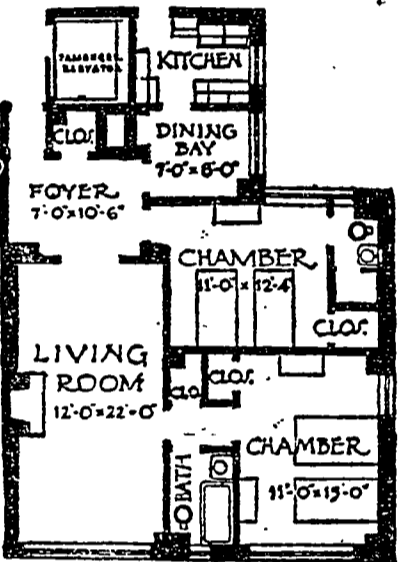

8 DEAD IN STORMS IN THE SOUTHWEST

Property Damage Put at \$1,500,000 From Reversed Tornado, Rain and Floods.

THREE STATES AFFECTED

Red Cross at Washington Authorizes Continued Relief for Thousands Homeless.

KANSAS CITY, June 18 (AP).—Eight dead, hundreds homeless and property damage in the neighborhood of \$2,000,000 was the toll tonight of the week-end storms which swept over Southwestern Oklahoma, Southern Kansas and Southwestern Missouri.

Many farmers in southern Pratt and Kiowa Counties lost their crops homeless as the result of a twister which swept a path a quarter of a mile wide between Greensburg and Saward, Wisnema in the evening.

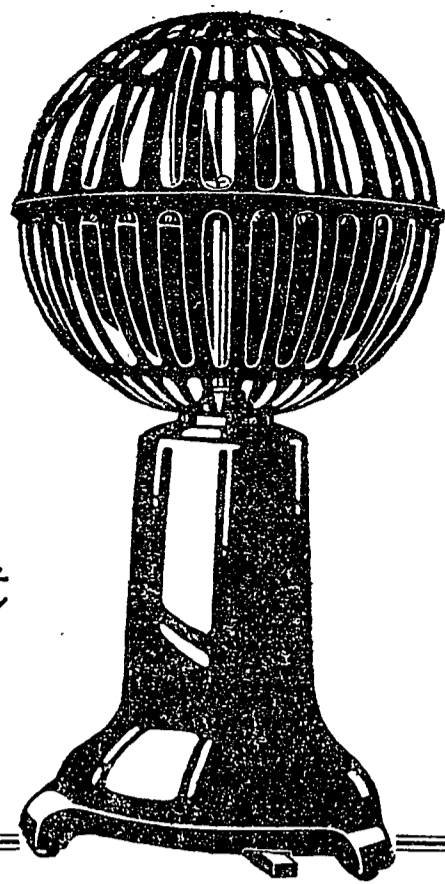

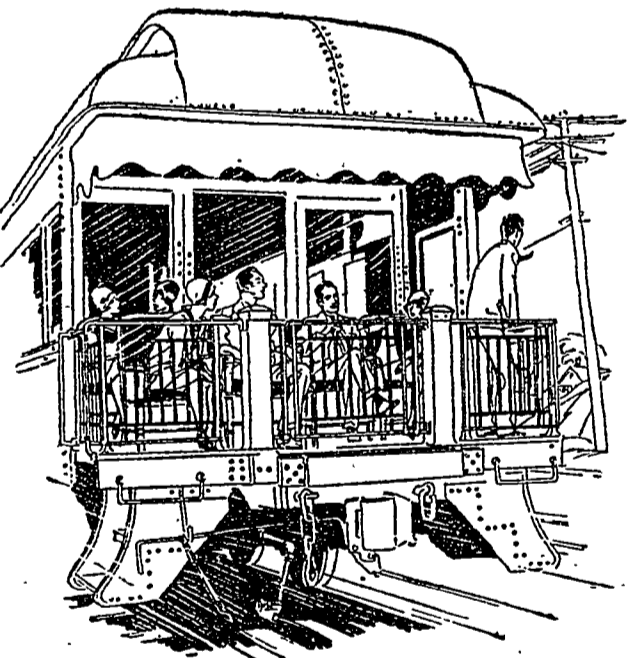
